Faith Hektoen Award Nominators - Instructions and Recommendations

Who is eligible for nomination?

Any person or group that has made an impact on library service to children in Connecticut at the local and/or state level.

Who can nominate a person or group for the Faith Hektoen Award?

- Colleagues or peers in the library profession
- Directors or supervisors of the nominee
- Members of the Friends of the Library groups or Library Board of Trustees

What are the categories of nomination?

- Outstanding Project or Program
- Career Achievement

What is an eligible Outstanding Project or Program?

Any program that has taken place during the last two years or an on-going program that has made a significant impact to children in Connecticut at the local, regional, and/or state level.

Who is eligible for Career Achievement?

Any person or group/organization that has had a significant impact on library service to children in Connecticut at the local, regional, and/or state level.

What does the winner receive?

An award and recognition at the CLA Annual Conference in April at the Crowne Plaza in Cromwell, CT.
